Geography & Science

In Geography, we will explore the UK coastline to identify human and physical features. We use geographical language to talk about lighthouses, the beach, cliffs and lots of tourist attractions!

We will find out that the UK is made up of four countries and we will discover where each country fits into the UK on a map.

In Science we will look at the properties of everyday materials and think about what would protect us from the rain at the coast. We will learn about the Scientist Charles Mackintosh and discover that he invented waterproof fabric. Finally, we will text materials to see which one would be best for an umbrella!

PSHE

During Circle Times, we will learn that families include a range of people. We will understand who our friends are and how to overcome problems in friendships. We will be able to describe what people look like when they are feeling worried, scared, upset or angry and know there are ways to help. We will continue to learn how to BE READY, BE SAFE and BE RESPECTFUL.

Music

In Music, we will focus on dynamics to create our own seaside soundscape to perform to each other.



Art

We will learn about the French artist Picasso during our Art lessons. We will explore some of his paintings, sculptures and prints and discover that his style includes, patterns, space and shapes. We will use Styrofoam, rollers and special ink to explore how printed patterns are created. Finally, we will print our own Christmas cards!



PE

Premier Sports Coaches will deliver our Gymnastic lessons. These will focus on balances, partner work and sequencing. In Games, we will develop our throwing and catching skills.

English

In English, we will read the story 'Katie in London.' We will learn facts about famous landmarks in London and create our own Non- Chronological Report to teach others about the information we have learnt! We will continue to focus on using our phonemes to spell, capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We will begin to extend their sentences by using 'and' to join words.

Maths

We will consolidate our number bonds within 10 before progressing onto knowing which symbols to use when writing addition and subtraction numbers sentences. We will use a variety of manipulatives and representations to support our calculations such as partwhole models, tens frames and number lines. We will also explore shape and begin to know and understand names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

RE

We will explore how some people understand God by asking the question: what do some people believe God looks like? We will recognise that different faiths have different beliefs about God's form and appearance and know how Christian, Muslim and Hindu people refer to God. We will show respect when exploring how different religions refer to God.




