- Sea Creatures Fact File

Turtles
Turtles live in rivers and oceans. They eat fruit, plants, insects and other animals. They sometimes eat jellyfish! Turtles can't move very fast and they can be mistaken for people who want to keep them as pets. Plastic in the ocean looks like jellyfish to turtles and they can eat it. This makes them ill.
Size: 2m (leatherback turtle)
