Later that afternoon, we met back in the hall to share our findings and showcase our art and crafts, some of which will soon be on display. We enjoyed watching children who were learning about France perform the Can-Can dance and sing 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes' in French. We heard children counting in Mandarin and they showed us how to write numbers using Chinese symbols. Many classes sampled delicious foods from their studied countries including Welsh cakes, French cheeses, Chinese prawn crackers and Irish_soda bread. What a fun-filled and interesting day it was! EYFS

Year 1

We have also learned about time order words, verbs and other instructional text features in preparation for writing our own set of instructions for making a sandwich. We have found out about 'Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot' in History and thought about how we remember this event through Bonfire Night. In Art, we have explored using pastels and glitter paints to create beautiful bonfire silhouette pictures.

Year 2

After travelling to three countries in one day Year 2 have finally arrived in their 'Passport Around the World' topic! We have been looking at some artefacts belonging to Phileas Fogg and thinking about what he would need as he travels. We have explored maps, atlases and globes and are beginning to remember the 7 continents and the 5 oceans that Phileas Fogg visited as well as discovering facts about different countries. In English, we have been identifying features of recounts and using this information to write about the Wright brothers and the very

first aeroplane flight. We are even using conjunctions like 'because', 'when' and 'that' to add extra detail!
