## PE Reminder - EARRINGS.

The Association of Physical Education (2020) strongly recommends that the removal of personal items before every PE lesson (this includes our sports clubs). This is to ensure children can actively participate without endangering themselves or those around them. This applies to all earrings including retainer earrings. We do not allow earrings to be covered by plasters.

Therefore, if your child has their ears pierced, please ensure that earrings are taken out before school on the days that the class has PE (school staff are not permitted to remove them). This will enable your child to be fully active in our PE Curriculum and to develop the key skills taught by teaching staff and sports coaches safely.

For children who choose to wear earrings to school, these should be small studs and not hoops, for health & safety reasons.

#### Cycles/Scooters/Gates

We are happy for child to come to school on bikes & scooters. However, you need to ensure these are left securely i.e. locked with a padlock in our cycle storage. We do not accept any responsibility for loss or damage. Our cycle shed should only be used by INFANT school children.

Bikes and scooters should NOT be ridden on school premises, and we respectfully ask that you dismount before entering the gates. Reminder that the gate between us and the Academy is now locked at 8.45am.

#### New Student Database (Bromcom)

Over the holidays our student data has transferred to a new database called Bromcom. This is to bring us in line with our other Trust schools. As you can appreciate, the Admin team have had limited time to learn the new system and the reports it produces. Therefore, if classroom staff explain that one of your contacts is not now showing on your child's records and asks you to go to the office, please be kind and patient while we check and resolve the issue.

This system is to safeguard your child from going home with the wrong person!

#### **Get Reading!**

Enjoying a book together is very important for every child and family! We want every child in our school to enjoy reading which is why we send reading books and reading records home. But reading doesn't always involve a book. It might be following a recipe to cook something together, following instructions (even to make a paper aeroplane), reading a road sign, a comic or a book from the library.

At Dogsthorpe Infants, we really want to bring the enjoyment of reading back to the children, so if your child doesn't want to read their school reading book but has happily read one of their own books with you or a comic please write the date, what they have read and sign your name in the reading record. Any reading they have done is perfect to write down for us!

Reading should be enjoyable for everyone! Even the parents listening and helping...

We would really like you to write in their reading record at least 3 times a week...5 times would be **AMAZING!**
