Fit for Fun/Britain is Great Day

We will finish Summer 1 term next Thursday & Friday with a 'Fit for Fun' day and 'Britain is Great' Day! ALL children need to come to school on BOTH days ready dressed in PE kit.

Thursday 26th May - Fit for Fun Day

Throughout the day, each year group will be taking part in sporting and mental health & well-being activities. We will be looking at the history of the Olympics, including the Paralympics, and the athletes that take part and how they model our Shine Values that we can learn from.

Friday 27th May - Britain is Great Day

In the morning we will be welcoming two GB Athletes to our school:

Chad Miller - Team GB Bronze medallist U20 World Championships in the 100m and ranked 1st for his age group for the 2020-2021. He is one of the rising star in UK athletics and is one of the fastest sprinters in the country this year. There is genuine hope that Chad might become only the 7th person in British history to hit the sub 10 second mark in the 100 metres, watch this space!!

Rechmial Miller -Sprinter from London who has competed for Team England at elite events worldwide. He has won international medals over the 100 metres for Team GB at youth level and following the pandemic is back in training with aspirations to compete at the Commonwealth Games.

Both of these athletes certainly show our Shine values of DETERMINATION, PERSERVERANCE & RESILLENCE.

At lunchtime, our caterers abm have organised a Jubilee Street Party themed lunch for all children - the menu is attached. PLEASE NOTE - THIS IS THE ONLY SCHOOL MEAL OPTION ON THIS DAY, THERE IS NO HOT MEAL CHOICE. Alternatively, children can bring their own packed lunch from home.


The celebrations will continue in the afternoon with the staff and children celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and taking part in activities that make our country GREAT!

Anyone eligible for vaccinations can now walk-in to any of the large-scale Covid Vaccination centres. This includes 5-11-year-olds, and sessions are available at weekends and some evenings (see below details). Appointments can be booked if preferred. The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fostering Service receives around 50 referrals every month, and we are doing everything we can to provide nurturing environments for our children and young person who need our help. We particularly need people who have experience of working with children, such as teachers, teaching assistants and other professionals from the education sector.

As your Local Authority, we are uniquely placed to support our Foster Carers un the following ways:

- 1. We are a not-for profit organisation and invest in our children, young people and Foster Carers
- 2. We enable young people to stay close to their family, friends and schools
- 3. Our carers are the first to hear about the children and young people who need a home and a loving family
- 4. If a decision needs to be made about the child, we can make it quickly as the Local Authority is the decision maker
- 5. We offer our carers excellent bespoke training and support
- 6. We are competitive in pay against IFAs with additional tax savings
