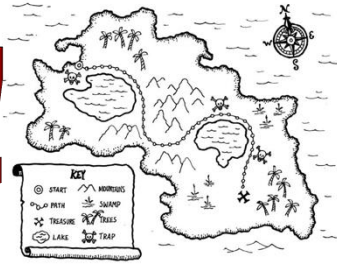




Ahoy There!

Ahoy matesys! Since people first sailed on the oceans there have been pirates. In **Geography**, we will become pirates for the day and use maps, globes and atlases to discover the 5 oceans and the 7 continents of the world. We will discover islands and consider the landscapes, climate and location to decide where we will bury our treasure. We will use compasses to find out the direction that we are travelling and create our own treasure maps! Excitingly, we will use instruments to create, select and combine sounds to compose and perform a soundscape of the British Isles **Music**.

We will explore and use mechanisms in **DT**. We will use a range of tools and equipment to create levers, sliders and springs, all with a pirate theme!

In our Geography double page spread, we will share our knowledge of continents and oceans creatively using DT skills.

We will have a sports coach in school to develop our Athletic skills in **PE**. We will explore moving in unison as pirates in **Dance**.

We will consider people who care for us in **PSHE**. We will identify the characteristics of healthy family life, and how families provide protection and care in times of difficulty. We will recognise the importance of spending time together and of sharing each other's lives.

In **English**, we will focus on conjunctions, adjectives and past tense as we explore the narrative 'The Night Pirates.' We will use our English skills to invent new characters to write our own pirate stories.

Later on, we will use conjunctions to answer the big question in Geography; **Where is the best place to live in the world?**

In **Maths**, we will focus on measure. We will explore capacity, mass, length and height and time. We will read scales with different increments and clocks. We will use this knowledge to solve problems involving measure.

Using Beebots, we will use positional and directional language to find buried treasure!

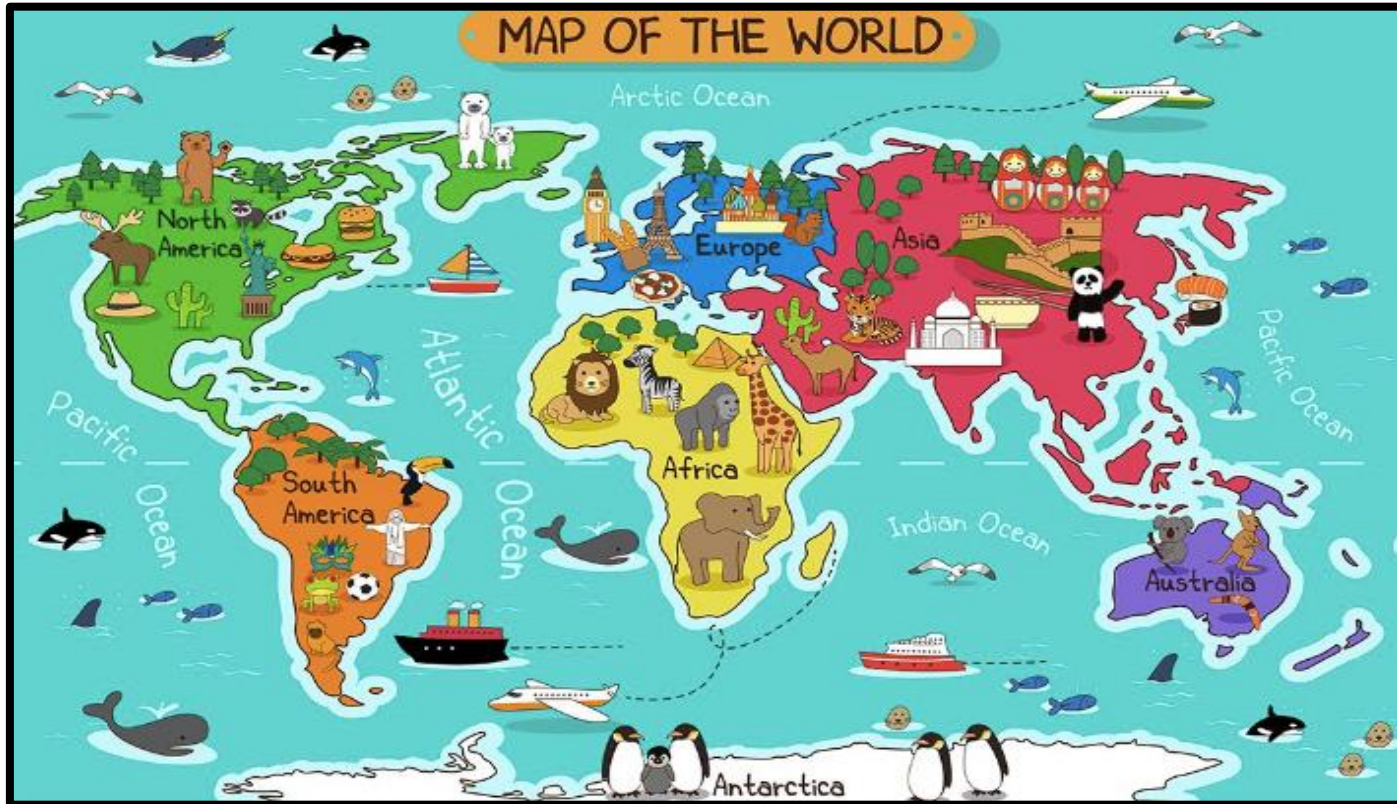
In **RE**, we will discover how weddings are celebrated by exploring the symbols, rituals and traditions of Christian, Muslim, and Sikh weddings. We will reflect on why weddings are important.

Our focus in **Science** is **MATERIALS**. We will be comparing and classifying different materials and understand the purposes of materials. Glossary
