Literacy.




This area of development is all about Reading and Writing.

Your child does not need to be able to read and write before starting school. They should be developing a love of stories and songs and they should be able to make simple marks and talk about them.





Breaking simple words down into their sounds, or doing 'sound talk' is the first step for reading and writing. Play 'I Spy' where you say an initial sound or a simple word in sound talk and the child has to work out what it is.



Read at least 1 book together every day, even if it is same book each time! Talk about what you see in the pictures and think about what could happen next before turning the pages. Read in different places to make it fun! You can even try acting out the stories!
